

MISSING NAVAL GUNNERS NAMED

The Navy Department today announced the names of 14 members of a Navy gun crew who are missing since the Liberty ship *John W. Weeks* sank April 19 in Alaskan waters after breaking apart.

Forty officers and men of the merchant crew and an Army cargo security officer also are missing. Children members of the gun crew and two merchant seamen were rescued.

NAZI BOMB HITS BRITISH SHELTER

LONDON, April 27.—(U)—A number of persons were killed last night when a German raiding high explosive bomb hit the underground shelter in which about 60 adults and children had sought haven at a south coast town.

Bombs fell in a tenement district, smashing a mission hall and several taverns. The town cannot be named. The German radio reported that the town was subjected to a sharp attack.

2 Nazis Escape Prisoner Camp At Fort Lewis

Two youthful German prisoners of war, who were in Kommands Africa Corps and were captured in Tunisia in May, 1943, were seen today by the Federal Bureau of Investigation, police and military authorities after their escape from Fort Lewis yesterday afternoon.

The two, Alexander "Buster" Gardner, 22 years old, and Walter Thelacker, 24, were the first escapees from the prisoner-of-war camp at Fort Lewis.

Guards believe the men escaped between 2:30 and 4:30 p.m. through the extreme north boundary of the fort, three-fourths of a mile south of the Steelcase road-rail station. They were working in a timbered area.

Both wore blue clothing. Thelacker was described as 5 feet, 7 inches in height, 182 pounds with blue eyes, olive skin, brown hair, and a scar on the left thumb. His brother is 5 feet, 8 inches, 237 pounds, with blue eyes, fair skin and brown hair.

Both wore blue work clothing with large white P. M.'s on the right arm and P on the left. However, they may have worn letters from their coats, warned Leland V. Boardman, special agent in charge of the F. B. I., or they may have obtained Army uniforms.

May Have Canteen Checks

Authorities believed neither possessed American currency, but added they may carry Fort Lewis canteen-check booklets, which are known to speak English.

Boardman expressed any information concerning the men reported to the F. B. I. immediately at 407 United States Courthouse, Main 0460.

At the same time, officials of the Army Air Base at Fort Lewis, N. M., conducted a similar search for two other escapees—Eudolph Firth, 30, and Mueller, 28, who also disappeared yesterday afternoon, according to the Associated Press.

Auto Collision Upsets Driver's Draft, Wedding

Matrimony and the Army both were thwarted this morning about 8:40 o'clock when Keith Gibson, 26 years old, 3275 38th Ave. S. W., who was on the way to the Army induction station from his draft board, became involved in a three-automobile accident at Fifth and Duane North and Harrison Street, according to Traffic Investigators C. C. McCoy and C. E. Gibson, police said, had intended to report to the induction station and then leave for Eastern Washington, where he was to be married later in the week. Instead, he collided with one driven by Richard S. McDonald, 112-A Aloha St., turned over and struck a car and laundry truck. Gibson was charged with negligent driving and taken to Harborview County Hospital, suffering a possible cerebral concussion and a fractured jaw.
